This list is sorted by grade level. If you wish to purchase all of the equipment at once, feel free to do so. I have separated it into specific grade level requirements to spread out the cost over several years rather than all at once. Also, sticks and mallets will wear out over time with constant use, so there will come a time that you will need to replace your mallets.

**Remember:** It is very important to either get the exact mallets listed or an equivalent model from another company. It's the type of hardness with the mallet that is most important. There are many companies that make great percussion mallets. This is our instrument; it is not acceptable to borrow from other players in the percussion section. If you do not have the correct sticks then it is the same as not having your instrument for that day. These supplies will get you throughout high school. There may be an occasional time that you will need to buy a special stick or mallet for a solo or ensemble.
